2022-2023 Accomplishments:

Academic Excellence developed and presented for Governance Council (GC) review and approval: (1) "CEC Advisor Goals and Expectations" that are consistent with the CEC's mission, and reinforce our public communications describing the distinguishing features of the CEC as an option for students and families. (2) Proposals for academic sections of the charter contract expiring on 6/30/2023 (e.g., programming, curriculum, performance measures, evidence). (3) Criteria and processes for developing sustainable electives and course offerings (including health) for middle school grades. (4) Suggestions for the CEC Family Handbook to increase its value as tool for strengthening relationships with families in our school and district communities. (5) A goal to structure the CEC's Annual Report so that it serves as a monitoring piece useful to the CECGC and the Board of Education.

CHAIN COMMUNITY GARDEN

Mission: The mission of the Chain Community Garden is to create and manage a place and space to provide fresh produce and agricultural opportunities to students and the community of Waupaca.

2022-2023 Accomplishments:

The Garden Committee: (1) Planned and maintained a garden that welcomed community members and organizations (plots "paid for" with 20 hours of summer garden service), Wednesday-morning community workdays, CEC student and Advisor participation, summer school classes, produce harvests to fight community food insecurity, community events – and chickens! (2) Partnered with FoodWise and the Waupaca Area Public Library to offer community activities at the CEC; including a Strawberry Moon walk, story time, and strawberry snacks; and story time and a garden tour during our annual Corn Roast. (3) Benefited from grants from the Waupaca Community Foundation (2022), and the American Transmission Company's "Trees for Threes" program. (4) Developed plans for a summer Garden with even more community plots and involvement.

2022-2023 Accomplishments:

The Committee focused on various areas of health/wellness and culture throughout the 2022-2023 school year: (1) Because the mission/vision of Cultivating Connections is to enhance the health and wellness of students and staff within the CEC, we wove multiple aspects of health into each activity and goal: physical, social, mental, intellectual, and spiritual. 


